Bell Frogs

Bell frogs are one of the few types of frogs found in New Plymouth's Pukekura Park. They are originally native to Australia, but are now found in New Zealand and New Caledonia.

An adult bell frog is between 5 and 11 cm long. They have a pointy snout, long legs and webbed back feet.

They have a good camouflage and like reedy environments.

Bell frogs are mostly aquatic and travel over land in periods of rainfall.



Facts

Remember to...

The best months to listen for frogs is November until January.

The best time to listen for frogs is from 8pm onwards

You have to be very quiet and sit still. Keep all torches off when listening for frogs.

Respect where the frog lives and never litter in or around their habitat.

Australian whistling tree frog

The Australian whistling tree frog is one of three species found in New Plymouth's Pukekura Park. The Australian whistling tree frog grows up to 30mm and have half-webbed back feet.

This species of frog is mostly found in wet and dry forests, grass lands, bog and coastal swamps and lagoons.

Help the frogs by not polluting the habitat that they live in.

Location

The main entrance at Fillis Street has easy access from the city centre, but there are actually 22 pedestrian entrances where you can enter the park.
